Letter from the President, Ray Fedele

LHA is hard at work "for the sake of the Lake" as you will see after reading this newsletter. Mark your calendar for two important events; The Annual Meeting on Sept 20th and The Shoreline Cleanup Day on Sept 24th. Articles including the details on each of these events are in this newsletter. Please feel free to invite your friends or neighborhood groups to participate.

As you will read, we will be working with a master's level student in Clemson's City and Regional Planning Program through 2022 and 2023. We will be gathering data on the growth around the lake and the shoreline impact this growth will have in the future. The data and findings will be shared with the Corps as well as all counties that boarder the lake to ensure future growth of the

shoreline is intelligently planned and implemented.

In the past 7-8 years we have been blessed with an abundance of rain to keep our lake at full pool and above. Recently the rain has been sporadic for months, so the lake level is dropping. We hope the above average prediction of tropical weather in the next few months with remedy the situation. Don't panic, if you have recently moved here these fluctuations are normal since Lake Hartwell is a reservoir. Remember we are only one of three lakes and a river that make up the Savannah River basin so all these reservoirs must be managed together. Hopefully rain will come during the upcoming hurricane season bringing the moderate drought under control.

WCSC is located at 34°29′59.1″N 82°47′45.2″W. WCSC is slightly southeast of channel marker S20 on the Seneca River arm of Lake Hartwell. The entrance to the club harbor is on the south side of the peninsula.

WINTERIZING YOUR BOAT: STEP-BY-STEP GUIDE

In the Southeast, many people don't think you need to winterize a boat. This is not true. Many times, the temperature dips down below so you need to be prepared especially if you keep your boat out of the water. Start by prepping your engine; ensure all water has been drained and removed.

- 1. Apply corrosion protection to your engine, fogging if recommended
- 2. Add a fuel-stabilizing additive to your fuel system; then run the engine.
- 3. Change your engine's fuel filters and any fuel/water separators in the system.
- 4. Drain your boat's freshwater plumbing systems (sinks, tanks, and heads).
- 5. Add antifreeze to your plumbing systems.
- 6. Ensure water is removed from all additional systems (raw water washdowns, LiveWell, bilge pump, etc.).
- 7. Remove drain plugs.
- 8. Cover your boat with a secure cover that drains properly and lower your engine or outdrive.

GUARD AGAINST THEFT!

After a summer full of boating and water recreation fun, our boats and docks will see less activity as the cooler temperatures creep back in. Unfortunately, as trips to the dock decrease, opportunities for theft can increase. With high fuel prices, theft of fuel has already been on the rise.

SECURE IT: Take every measure available to secure and lock your boats, watercraft, dock storage units, autos and homes and let your home and dock neighbors know when you are gone on vacation.

- Use multiple locks Make sure to have locks on you trailer, cover, fuel cap and other key points throughout the vessel.
- Use boat covers When not in use, protect your boat using a secured, full boat cover.
- Use anti-siphon devices If a fuel locking fuel cap is not available for your boat, try a device that prevents fuel siphoning.
- Leave valuables off of the dock and boat Never leave loose valuable items in view or unattended
- Add cameras or security system Lights and cameras are key component to ensuring the protection of your boat and dock, as they are deterrent for any thief. Please follow all USACE SMP guidelines when adding lights and security at the dock.

RECORD IT: Keep a written and photographic record of valuables. This helps to provide an accurate description to law enforcement and improve chances for their recovery.

REPORT IT: If you discover your property has been stolen, alert your:

- Local county sheriff
- Insurance company
- Neighbors, friends and other boaters



LHA PARTNERS WITH CLEMSON ON LAKE HARTWELL GROWTH AND DEVELOPMENT PLANNING.

Lake Hartwell Association (LHA) is partnering with Clemson University, City and Regional Planning Program, on a new initiative aimed at developing growth planning suggestions and guidelines for Lake Hartwell. This was initiated by LHA and works towards a key element of LHA of protecting the quality and quantity of lake resources. LHA is funding a graduate student intern for 20 hours/week from this program for the entire academic year, as a Public Service Assistantship (PSA). A large component of the initial work will be utilizing GIS data from the past and current to assess growth areas around the lake and 'hot spots' where additional growth could occur. This is population based analysis, not market based or market driven. From this data, our long term goal of this initiative is to develop planning guidelines and a planning document that could be used for both the Corps and adjacent counties towards managing the projected growth around the lake. Like other popular areas, growth is coming and accelerating. This initiative is aimed at getting ahead of things and putting some organized planning guidelines in place for future consideration and to get the Corps and adjacent counties to consider using these guidelines. We will provide updates in future newsletters as this program evolves.

Volunteers are needed to help make this new event, the Great Lake Hartwell Trash Pick Up a success. We encourage any and all local residents, visitors, scout groups, civic clubs or businesses to sign up using the QR Code on the attached flyer. There are several different opportunities for participation. Sign up and show up by land at one of the locations listed in the flyer. A site director will have instructions and directions to areas needing rubbish pick up. Boat up and collect your supplies at the listed ramps and claim your own area for cleanup. You could also by pass site check in and use your own supplies, choose and island or shoreline to clean up and drop your rubbish at one of the assigned sites. It beneficial to all to use the designated areas for waste disposal in an effort to keep track of the amounts collected. All areas of the lake are available for rubbish clean up. Membership Renewal Process

Have you received your renewal notice in the mail and wondered why you are receiving this notice when it hasn't been a year since you joined or last renewed? If so, this process may help explain.

- 1) When a new member joins LHA, that initial join date becomes their annual renewal date.
- 2) LHA sends renewal notices on a quarterly basis. Anyone that joined in January, February or March should receive their renewal notice in the 1st quarter billing, usually mailed in January. Anyone that joined in April, May, or June should receive their renewal notice in the 2nd quarter billing, usually mailed in April. Anyone that joined in July, August or September should receive their renewal notice in the 3rd quarter billing, usually mailed in July. Anyone that joined in October, November or December should receive their renewal notice in the 4th quarter billing, usually mailed in October.
- 3) Any members that don't renew in the quarter of their annual renewal date will receive another annual renewal notice the following quarter mailing.
- 4) If no payment is received 6 months past the annual renewal date, then a late notice is mailed. No renewal payment after this this point results in removal from email distribution and newsletter mailing.

Have you wondered why the renewal notice asks for your address and contact information each year?

- 1) LHA maintains a membership list with contact information. This annual reminder is an opportunity for us to get updates from members about address, email or phone number changes.
- 2) LHA is in the process of creating a master mailing list of all lake properties. We appreciate when you include your "lake address" along with your mailing address when applicable. For example: When a member joins and gives their mailing address in Greenville or Atlanta area, we don't know if that members is a recreational user on the lake or if they own property near the lake. This helps us determine the type of lake user the member is as well as what specific area of the lake is important to them. This also helps eliminate duplicate mailings to lake property owners.

Have you considered paying via credit card but unsure of the process? Here is a step by step process on how to subscribe for annual membership:

- 1) www.lakehartwellassociation.org, scroll down and click on "Join Us or Renew" (green box)
- 2) Scroll down and decide if you want to subscribe annually. Or make a one-time donation.
- 3) If you choose to subscribe, select your type of membership (Family, Admirals, Silver

Business, etc) from the drop down menu and then click on the yellow "Subscribe"

- 4) At this page, scroll past PayPal and click "Pay with Debit or Credit Card"
- 5) Enter your credit card and billing address information. Click "Agree & Subscribe"

This subscription will renew annually until you cancel. You can do this by logging in or contact LHA at mail@lakehartwellassociation.org

Cutting Trees Will Cost You!

The Corps of Engineers, Lake Hartwell is investigating and pursuing restitution for three cases of major tree cutting on the shoreline, which is public land.

The destruction cases represent an unprecedented increase in property owners illegally removing trees and vegetation along the lake shoreline, according to Sandy Campbell, Hartwell Natural Resource program manager.

Consequences for destruction of public lands may include fines, court appearances and in some cases revocation of all shoreline use permits for private boat docks and other permitted structures.

The trees and vegetation surrounding the lake serve act as a buffer and a filter for run-off from private property, which may contain fertilizers and herbicides from lawns and farms along with other pollutants from roadways. Without this natural filter contaminants seep directly into the lake impacting water quality. The forested shoreline also provides cover and habitat for wildlife and reduce shoreline erosion.
